## Good morning!

Health Services has confirmed that all 142 COVID-19 tests administered on Saturday, January 30<sup>th</sup> have returned and are negative.

Our thanks and congratulations go out to all of our students and families for the success we have accomplished as a community. We are very proud of all of you. As a reminder, day-7 tests will be scheduled for February 4-6.

Now that we have received the results of all tests, students are able to move from *room quarantine* to *campus quarantine* until all day-7 test results have returned (we anticipate this to last until just before classes begin on Monday, February 8<sup>th</sup>).

Under Campus Quarantine, students may leave their room and residence hall for meals and activities, but still must follow strict social distancing from other students and all staff, and must remain on campus.

Here is a more detailed list of what you can and cannot do under Campus Quarantine (also see the attached flyer that will be posted in the residence halls:

## **What you can do during Campus Quarantine** (expected to last until 2/8/2021):

- 1. Leave your room with your mask on.
- 2. Socialize in your own Residence Hall common areas (with masks on and while maintaining social distancing).
- 3. Leave your residence hall and travel around upper campus, campus trails, and campus roadways.
- 4. Enter the dining hall (beginning with breakfast on February 2<sup>nd</sup>) to select your meals togo.
- 5. Participate in all online events, activities, and programming.
- 6. Access campus resources and services online through Teams.

## What you **cannot** do during *Campus Quarantine* (expected to last until 2/8/2021):

- 1. Go into another student's room (even in your own building).
- 2. Go into another residence hall that is not your hall.
- 3. Socialize with students who are not from your hall without wearing masks and maintaining a strict 6-foot social distance at all times.
- 4. Go to the lower campus and enter any of the buildings.
- 5. Order food to be delivered to campus.
- 6. Leave campus.
