- Short term work experience for students on campus before they graduate
- Work program is supported by time in the classroom to process the experience
- Ability to gain professional experience in a developmental atmosphere that focuses on the success of the student

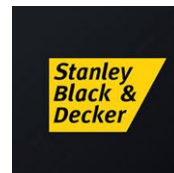
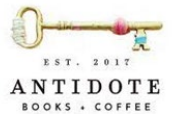

Local Internships

- Over 150 partnerships created with local businesses and organizations
- 50 internships posted (average)
- Students are supported through the application process which requires a resume, cover letter and interview.
- Cross registration within area colleges



Transferring and Partnership

- Landmark students transfer to 165 different institutions, with only 13 enrolling more than 3 LC students
- 90% of Landmark students that complete an associates degree go onto to pursue a bachelors degree
