The Need

Students often do not realize how different college is from high school. Without a fundamental understanding of the expectations, environment, and rigor at the college level, they are likely to struggle — or even fail — in their efforts to achieve academic and personal success.

This risk is even greater for students who learn differently.

Who Should Enroll?

College-bound high school juniors and seniors, and gap-year students who struggle with learning primarily due to:

- Learning disabilities (such as dyslexia)
- ADHD
- Autism
- Executive function challenges

Disability documentation is not required by Landmark College to participate.

Unique Program Model

Landmark College's online college courses use **Universal Design** and a **scaffolding** approach to instruction and supports. The program model is a collaboration between the College and individual high schools or districts, and includes a designated liaison at each participating school.

The **school liaison** provides onsite or online support with navigating online courses and executive function challenges. This partnership creates a highly personalized, **guided college-level learning experience** that targets the specific needs of each student.

Course Offerings

Each course earns 3 college credits. Areas of study include:

- Business
- Communication & Public Speaking
- Computer Science
- Education
- History
- Psychology
- Sociology

Perspectives in Learning Course

Participating students are encouraged to begin with our flagship strategies course, **Perspectives in Learning**.

This 3-credit education course helps build self-awareness, critical thinking, and self-advocacy skills — central to success in any college environment.

The course introduces students to:

- Theories related to learning
- Effective study strategies
- Disability-related laws
